

The Operation / Procedure

- 1. **Scaling / Root planning**: To remove plaque, calculus or stains from the tooth surfaces (Scaling) or root surfaces (Root Planning) by ultrasonic or hand instrument.
- 2. **Periodontal surgery**: A gingival flap is raised to expose the root of a tooth for root planning.

Indication and Intended Benefits and Expected Outcome

- 1. To prevent periodontal disease.
- 2. To eliminate periodontal pocket by removing plaque and calculus in the periodontal pocket and on the root surface of the tooth so that the periodontal tissues may re-attach onto the root surface.
- 3. To facilitate daily tooth brushing and interdental cleaning.

Preoperative Preparation

Patient should inform the dentist of any medical condition e.g. valvular heart disease, pacemaker, taking any anti-coagulants, etc.

Postoperative Instruction

- 1. Slight discomfort and **gum bleeding** for few days especially common with periodontal disease. Proper cleaning of teeth and oral hygiene will sooth the symptom and help return of periodontal health.
- 2. The swollen **gum may recede** upon healing (depending on severity of periodontal disease) making the root surfaces exposed and sensitive to hot / cold / sweet / sour food (desensitizing toothpaste may help relieving the discomfort), or widen interdental spaces (clean properly to prevent worsening of periodontal disease).

Risks and Complications

- 1. Common: bleeding, tooth sensitivity, or periodontal abscess.
- 2. Uncommon (<1% risk): sepsis or infective endocarditis.

Consequences if Untreated

Periodontal disease get worse, get infected and develop periodontal abscess.

Follow Up

See the doctor as scheduled.
